In the name of Allah, the Most Gracious, the Most Merciful;

And peace and blessings of Allah be upon Prophet Mohammed, the last of the Prophets and the Master of all Messengers.

In the name of Allah, who has forbidden Himself of oppression, enjoined justice, and made it one of His attributes. Justice by which the oppressor is prevented from exercising oppression, and the greedy is prevented from his greed, and thereby rights, properties and possessions are protected. Allah commanded people to populate and build the earth, fortify it with justice, purify its ways of oppression, and He endowed man with a mind capable of thinking and contemplating, so that man can legislate, implement, monitor and develop regulations, hence, rendering justice as a fortress that secures man throughout his lifetime.

ORGANIZING COMMITTEE OPENING SESSION SPEECH

The key developments are: privatization, various financing initiatives, pioneering renewable energy initiatives regionally and globally, and the new and unavoidable legislative initiatives accompanying these developments.

Therefore, it was crucial for us to focus on four main pillars at this year's Conference, which are:

- Privatization;
- Renewable energy;
- Financing; and
- Emerging legal sectors.

Each of these pillars sheds light on knowledge that enhances legal awareness and plays an important role in its development.

Pillar (1): Privatization

Privatization is the concern of every citizen who is keen on the interest of our country, as it is closely related to the realization of the key goals of Vision2030. Thereby, the private sector achieves its expected development, bearing its responsibility, of which it has been deprived of for many years, engaging with the business sector in achieving economic goals, and contributing to sustainable development.

In 2018, a special program was launched for privatization, linked to the National Center for Privatization, and defining the sectors to be privatized, the most important of which are: education and health, transportation and information technology, industry and mineral wealth, housing, Hajj and Umrah, and sports.

This is what has motivated the Conference to enlist «privatization» among the major pillars of the conference.

Pillar (2): Renewable energy

It is common knowledge that climate change has dangerous effects, such as changes in sea level, plant life, mass extinctions, and affects all human societies without exception. This is what has motivated the world to adopt initiatives and conclude agreements to confront the threat that jeopardizes the future of the globe, and any sustainable development. The most important of which is the United Nations General Assembly Resolution No. (2/55) of 2000, asserting the necessity to embark on the required reduction in emissions of greenhouse gases and to promote renewable energy sources, as well as the Paris Agreement of 2015. The Kingdom of Saudi Arabia has ratified both.

Therefore, the Kingdom, under its wise leadership, plays an important role in implementing all the provisions adopted under such agreements and initiatives. On its part, the Kingdom does not hesitate to issue constructive initiatives to reduce the effects of such threats, through the National Renewable Energy Program, and the initiatives it has launched, such as: **«Green Saudi Arabia»**, **«Green Middle East»**, **Sakaka Solar Power Plant**, and other initiatives that seek to localize renewable energy and enhance its impact.
